Virtues In Practice

Helping Children Grow Closer to Jesus

This month in our "Virtues in Practice" program, we will focus on the virtue of "forgiveness" which means "pardoning those who offend you".

We all know that God offers us freedom from our sins. However, every time we pray the Our Father, we place a condition on God's mercy towards us. We say, "Father, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." God's mercy cannot penetrate our hearts as long as we have not forgiven those who have sinned against us. We cannot love the God we cannot see if we do not love the brother or sister that we can see. It is in forgiving others that we experience true freedom from the bondage of sin. Forgiving others does not mean that we approve of their behaviour or do not want their actions to have consequences. It means that we let go of bitterness in our hearts and pray for God to show mercy to those who have wronged us.

"Lord Jesus, is there anyone I need to forgive? Please increase in me the virtue of **forgiveness**: help me to pardon those who have hurt me in any way. Teach me to trust that you will bring good out of evil and to recognize that a lack of forgiveness will only hurt me more. Cleanse my soul from bitterness and resentment and fill it with your amazing love and grace. Amen."

The goal of Catholic Education is heaven, but knowledge alone will not get us there! This program, "Virtues in Practice", is helping our students to live out their faith in their everyday lives.

Curriculum Updates








Grade 5SR Haikus

Saints Athletics



For the month ahead, our focus will be on coordination, cardiovascular endurance, and speed. The Primary students will continue to work with racquets and skipping ropes and will begin the fundamentals of track events. Intermediate students will learn about striking and fielding games, re-build their stamina and develop their speed during track training, and continue working on moving as a team through territorial games. During inclement weather, we will also focus on balance, strength and flexibility with our learning of fundamental gymnastics skills.

Kindergarten learning jump rope basics.






