





that darken our hearts as we search for light. We ask for attentiveness that we may truly see God's loving presence within and among us. We ask for renewed faith that we might be light for others.






Virtues in Practice

The Longhouse Experience

On Tuesday, November 8th and 9th, the Grade 4s had the opportunity to visit the Cheakamus Centre in Squamish. Their overnight experience was rooted in Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) culture.

We were guided by Matthew, a local Indigenous Coast Salish resident, along with other indigenous interpreters. We had the opportunity to spend most of our time immersed in traditional Coast Salish practices, in and around an authentic longhouse and a surrounding ecological reserve.

This overnight indigenous cultural program was based on three major ideas that under lie the activities at the longhouse: Respect, sharing and Seasonality.


As a result of our experiences we now have an enhanced understanding and respect for Skwxwú7mesh culture and traditional teachings. We experienced the traditional longhouse culture of the Coast Salish people, we worked alongside knowledgeable cultural program interpreters. We learned to cooperate with one another and we developed a strong sense of community.








Animals from the naming ceremony in the longhouse

November's learning experiences remained outdoors as we continued to hold PHE classes at our beloved Collingwood Park. In an article from the <u>International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health</u>, the importance of community greenspaces on children's health is highlighted.

...the availability of [Natural Outdoor Environments] NOE and the time that children spend in them have been associated with increased self-esteem, quality of life, respiratory health, physical activity, and lower body mass index (BMI). It has also been suggested that NOE provide benefits that directly influence cognitive development in children, as NOE provide opportunities that stimulate discovery, creativity, mastery, engagement, risk taking behavior, basic emotional states (e.g., surprise), and psychological restoration.






Community Connections

Remembrance Day | November 2022

We had two events that honoured our past and active military. On *All Souls Day* the No Stone Left Alone ceremony took place at Mountain View Cemetery. Students had the opportunity to meet 18 active military members from the 39 Canadian Brigade and the Dukes of Connaught's Own and place a poppy stone on a headstone. Grade 2 students and members of the Student Network returned to school to reflect on the experience. Our school was featured on the Global National No Stone Left Alone program on Nov. 11.



At our CISVA Networking Professional Day, we joined educators from four other CISVA schools to listen to the voices of elders and support workers from the Indian Residential Schools Survivors Society. (IRSSS). We were able to listen to their lived experiences and learn about the History and Impacts of Indian Residential Schools.

In the sacred fire exercise led by Chas Coultee, we learned about how all members of the family hurt when children

were taken away to Indian Residential Schools.
