I give thanks to all who were part of my journey and pray for each of you to keep your Faith and Trust that God will lead you to where you belong.



The goal of Catholic Education is heaven, but knowledge alone will not get us there! "Virtues in *Practice*" is helping us to live out our faith everyday.



## FRENCH LANGUAGE LEARNING UPDATE



With reference to the BC core French curriculum, our intermediate students have been expanding their learning by exploring greetings and cultural nuances—both verbal and non-verbal. Their learning goals during the first term include introducing themselves by sharing their name, age, and personal interests, as well as asking simple questions.

All learners are also being introduced to French phonemes starting with diphthongs, which support reading development and spelling of vocabulary words.

Interactive communication is a daily part of classroom life, with students regularly engaging in spoken French while reflecting on their learning goals. This immersive and supportive environment encourages confidence and growth in language skills.
