## Cards for Health Care Workers





## Christmas Musical 2021

St. Mary's School Fine Arts Department Presents  
"Arrest These Merry Gentlemen" a Musical Christmas Caper!

This year, for our Christmas Concert, we are preparing a full-scale musical, which involves **every student in our school from K to Grade 7!** Unfortunately, in compliance with CISVA COVID-19 guidelines, we will not be able to have a live audience again this year. However, we will record the entire performance and compile a video for you to enjoy. Regardless, the students are very excited and have been working hard in preparation. The recording of our musical will take place over 3 school days: **December 10** (recording of all drama scenes - select Grade 7 students only), **December 14** (recording of all bands Grades. 5-7), and **December 15** (recording of all classes K-4 as well as our 3 school choirs).

Here are the "costume" recommendations for each grade. The Grade 7 actors will be advised individually about their costumes for the drama portion of the musical.

**Please Note: Students should not wear the colour royal blue as we will be using a blue-screen background and anything that is blue in front of it will "disappear".**

K – Magi- wear any favourite Christmas outfit with crowns made at school

1 – Shepherds – wear any favourite Christmas outfit with shepherd-type headpieces (send in a plain-coloured towel that can be put on your child's head to mimic shepherd headdress)

2 – Townspeople of Bethlehem - wear any favourite Christmas outfit with biblical style headpieces (send in a plain-coloured towel that can be put on your child's head)

3 – Detectives – all dark tops and bottoms, "suits" if they own one, detective hats provided by the school

4 - 7 Plain white top, dark bottoms – jeans are ok as long as they have no holes or rips, tops may be short-sleeved but please no words or graphics (school polo shirt is ok)


